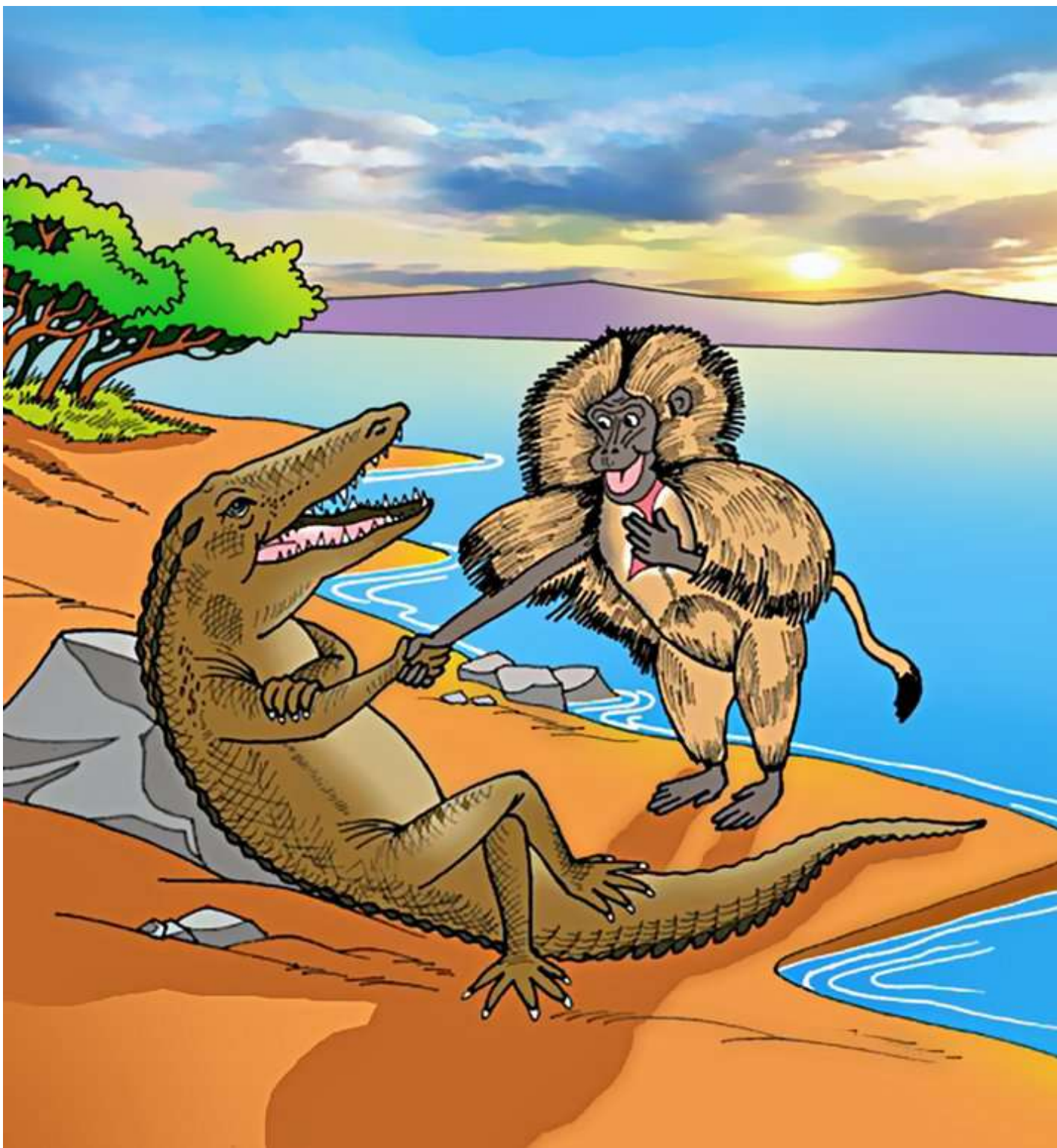

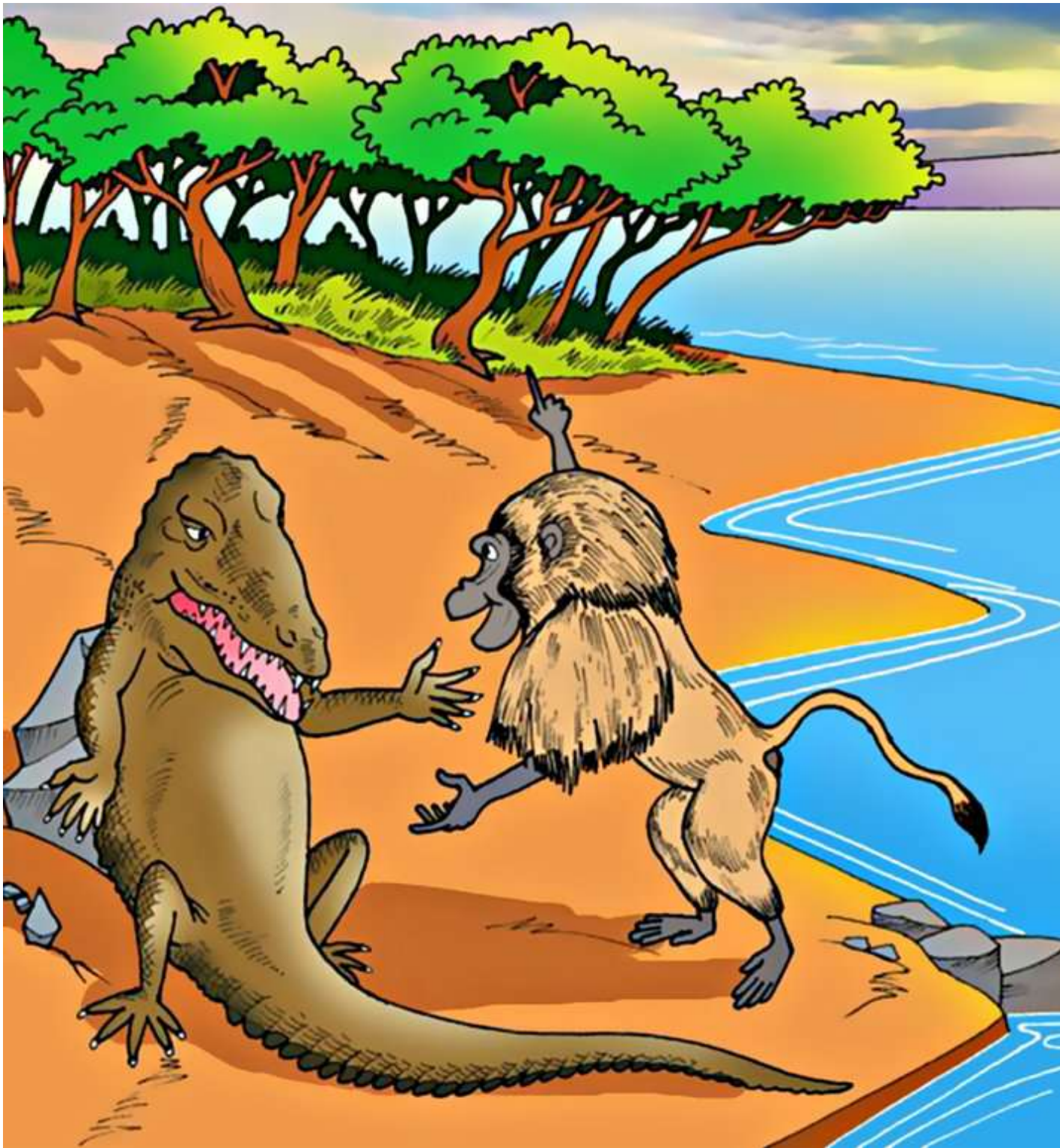

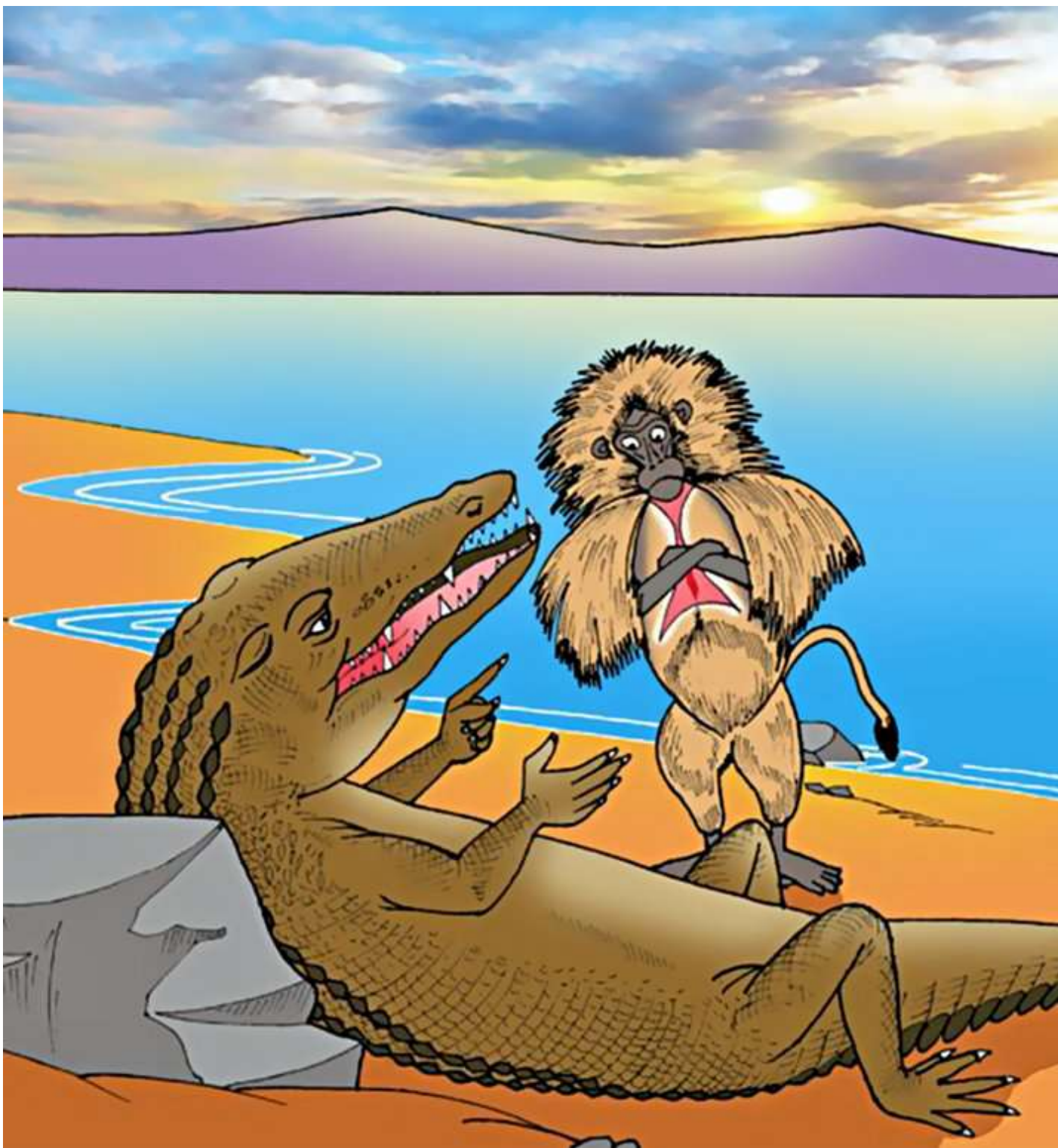
Ape meets Crocodile
by the lake.



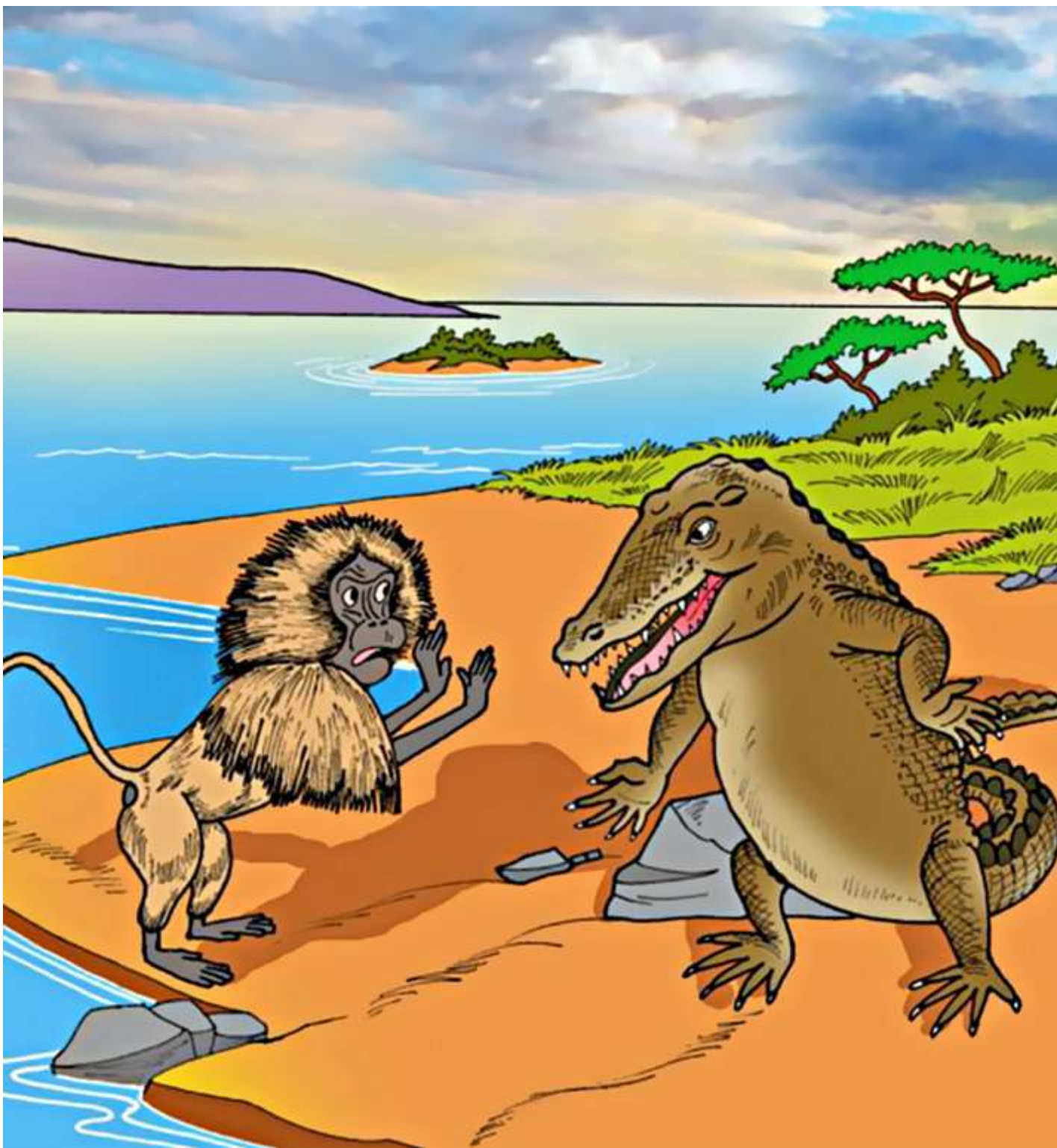
“Where do you live?” asks Ape. “In the lake,” says Crocodile.

“I cannot swim,” says Ape. “I can teach you.”



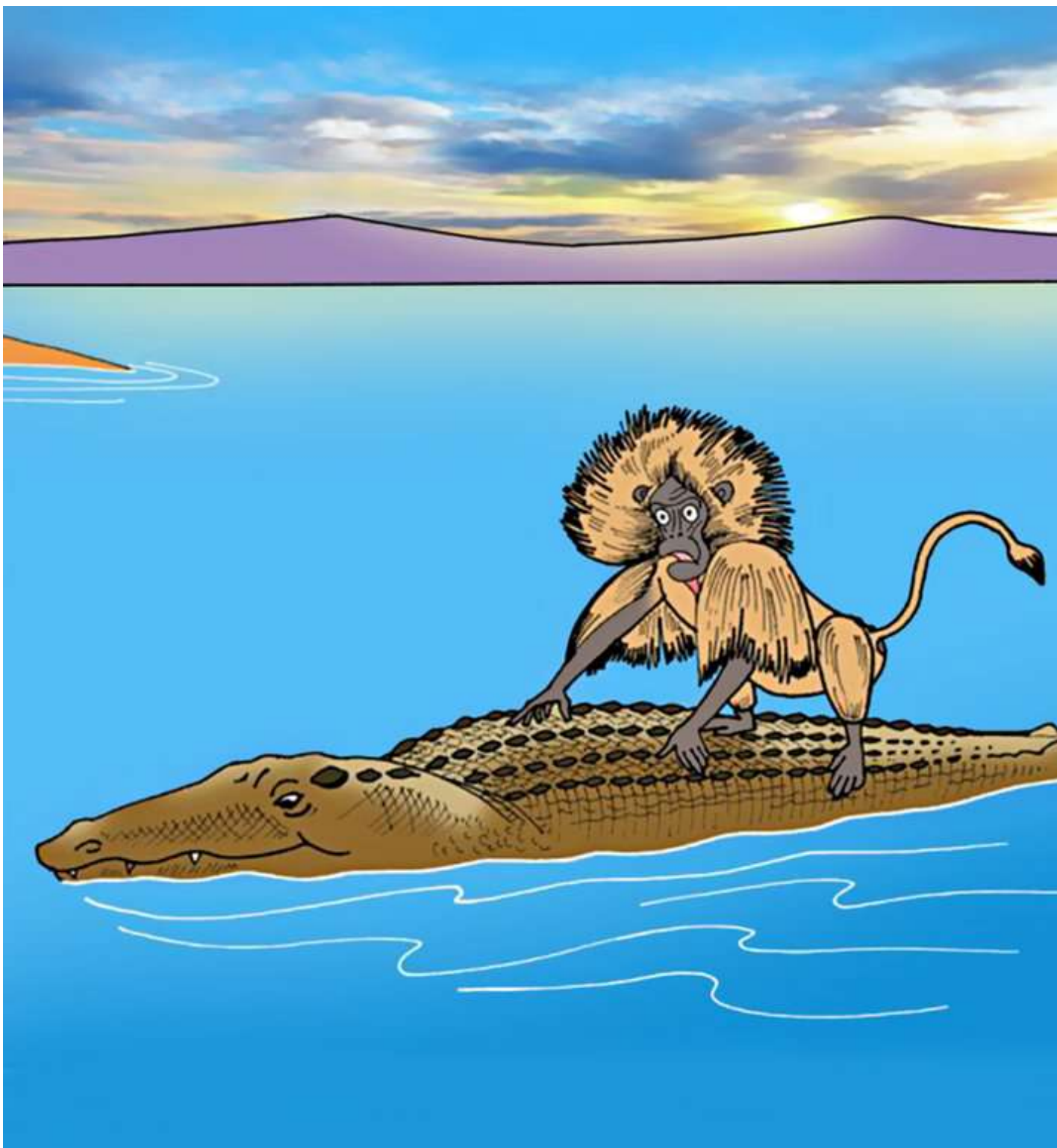
“We are friends. Do not be afraid,” says Crocodile.



“Ape, my uncle is sick. He needs meat,” says Crocodile.



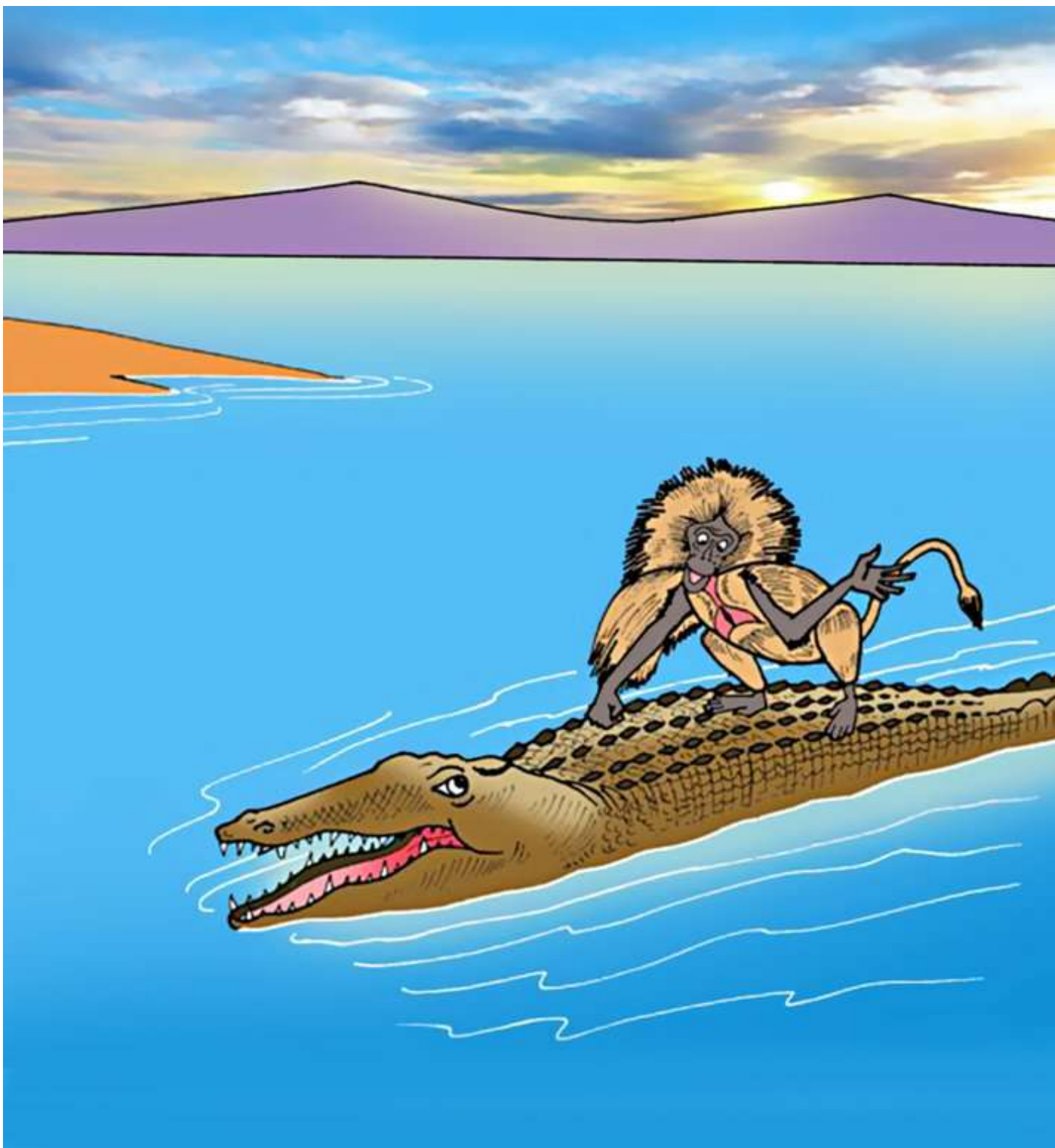
Ape is very afraid.

Ape wants to escape from Crocodile.



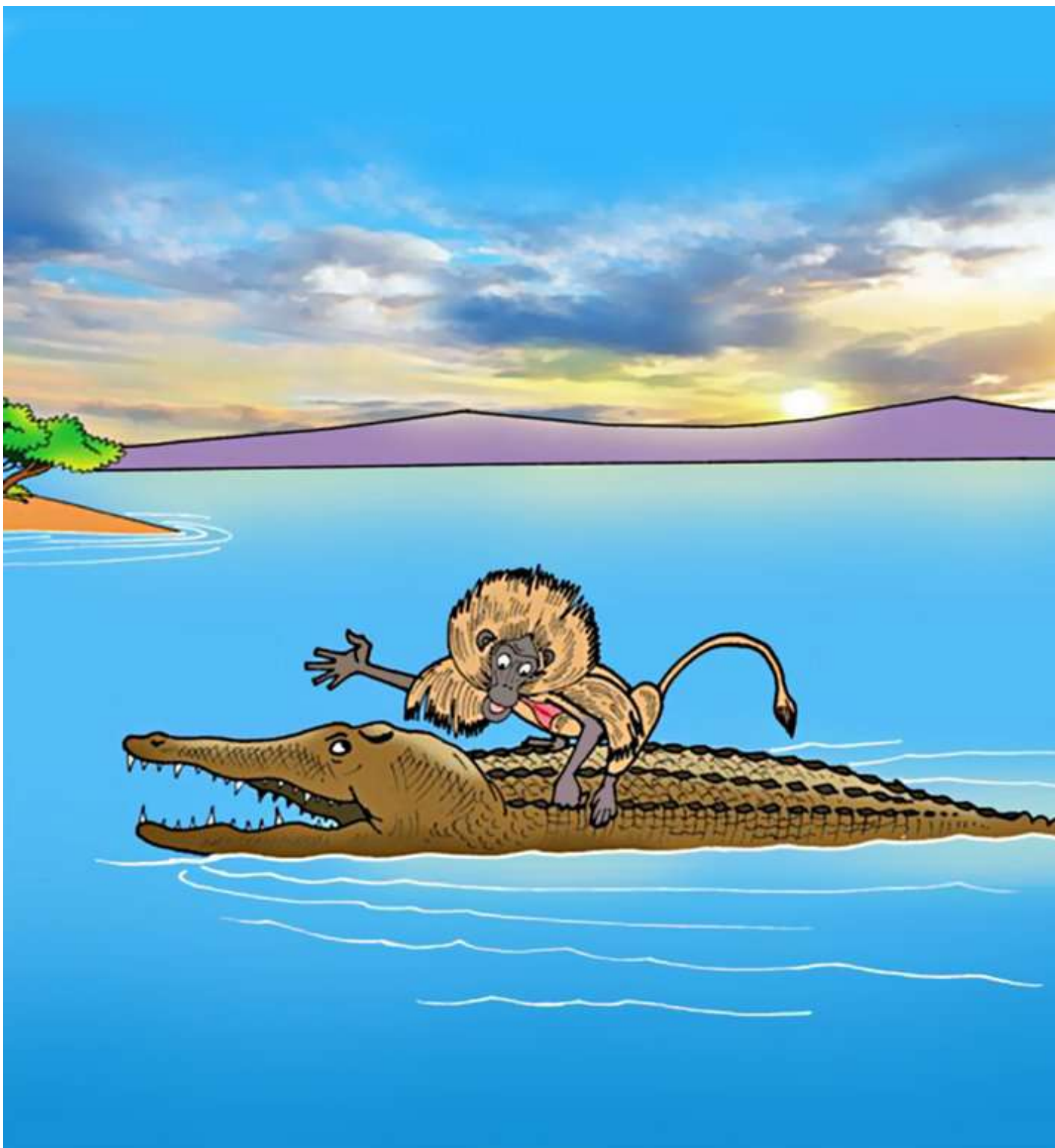
Ape has an idea.



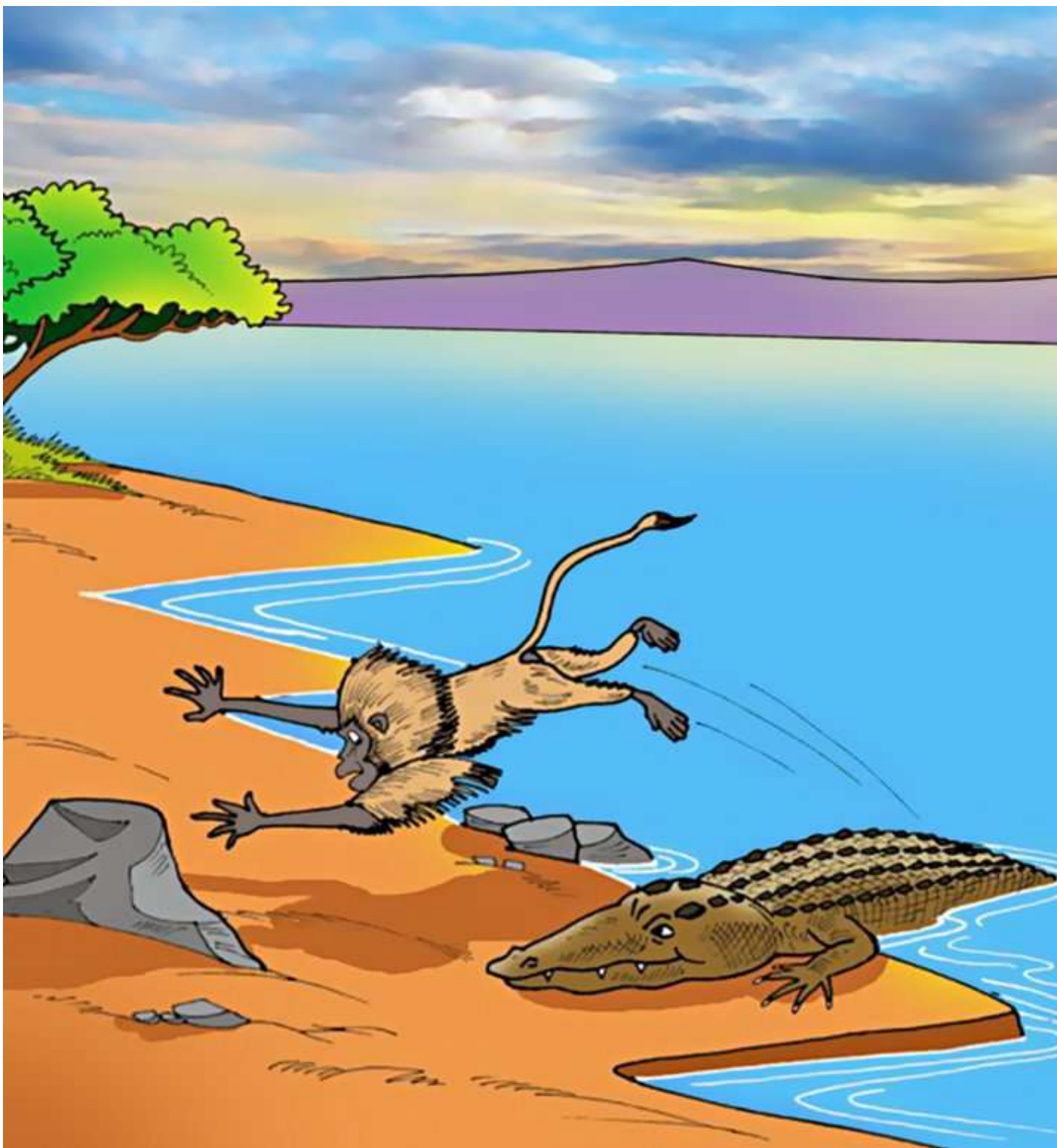
“I will give you my heart for him,” Ape promises.

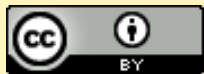
