"But where are my other clothes?"



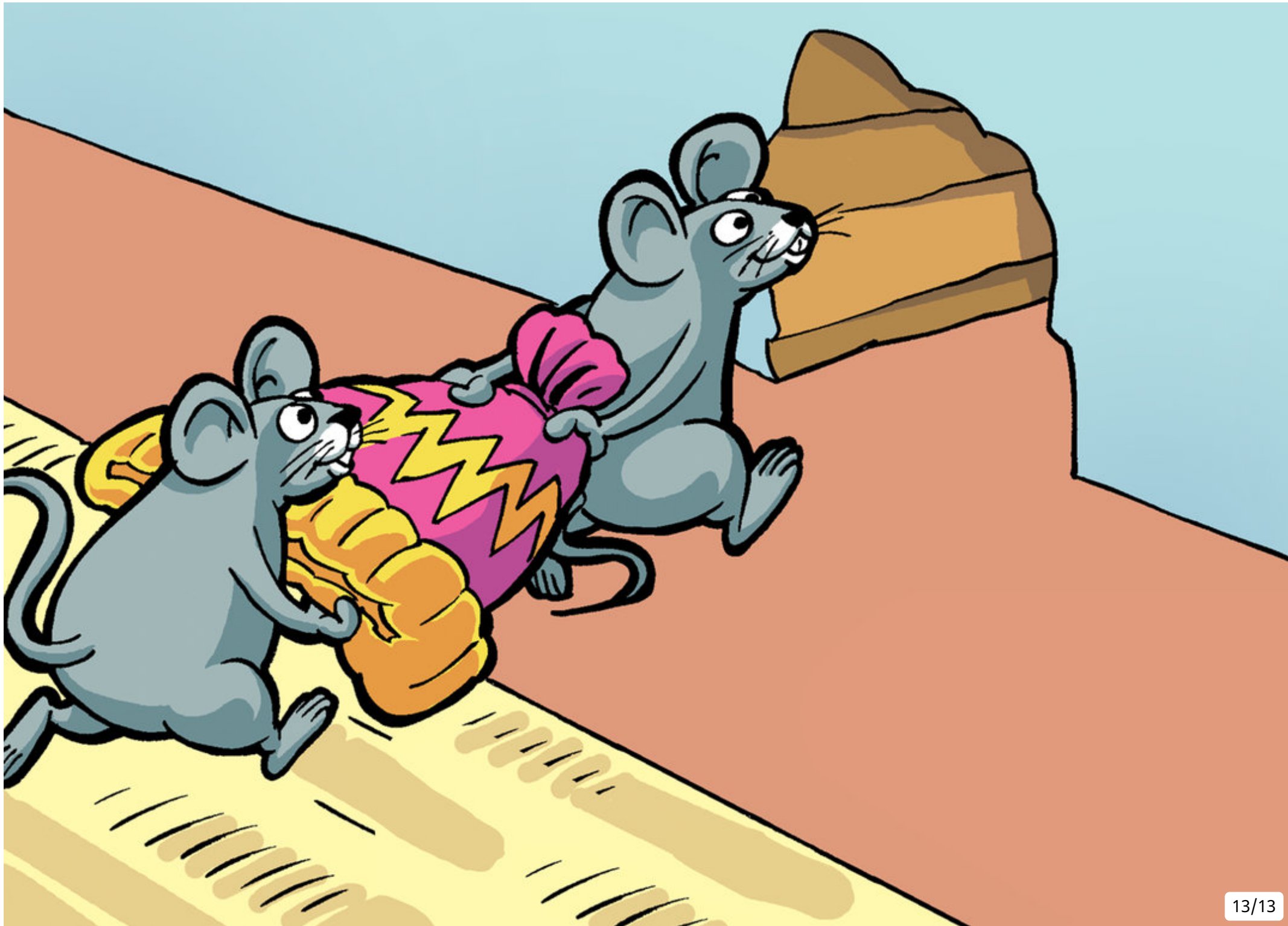
"Chunu, look here,"
